Red, She Said – *Alex Fong Galleria*

Artists Elaine Hatch, Allannah Weston, Audrey Krol, Lisa Hewitt, and Debby Merkel explore the profound nature of the colour red in this captivating exhibition. Red symbolizes passion, power, and emotion, and through each piece, the artists invite visitors to experience the complexities of this vibrant hue. From love and anger to danger and desire, "Red, She Said" is a testament to red’s ability to command attention and stir the soul.

Shades of Nature – *First Floor Studio Hallway*

Students of Elizabeth Dykosky present works that reflect their exploration of the natural world. This exhibition highlights the beauty and diversity of nature, expressed through a variety of styles and mediums.

Presence and Memory – *Mezzanine*

Kelowna-born emerging artist Kaelin Davis offers a contemplative collection that reflects on the beauty of life. Through colour and line, Davis delves into themes of solitude, grief, connection, and self-discovery. The works invite viewers to reflect on the past while embracing the present and looking forward with hope.

Myths, Fairy Tales, and Fables – *RCA Atrium*

This collaborative exhibition between the Medallion Art Society of Canada (MASC) and the Kelowna Sculptors Network Society (KSNS) explores storytelling through medals, sculptures, and 2D/3D artwork. Featuring the work of 17 MASC artists and 9 KSNS members, this collection will also be exhibited at the XXXVIII FIDEM Congress in Munich in 2025.

Fitzpatrick adds, “We warmly invite our entire community to enjoy these compelling works and look forward to welcoming art lovers of all ages and backgrounds to the RCA this fall.”
