RCA Presents Powerful Alt-Rock Artist Ché Aimee Dorval

(Kelowna, BC) – The Rotary Centre for the Arts is proud to welcome acclaimed Canadian artist Ché Aimee Dorval to the Mary Irwin Theatre as part of the RCA Presents 2025–2026 season on Thursday, May 30 at 7:30 PM. Known for her cinematic blend of alt-rock, trip-hop, dream pop, soul, and , Ché has collaborated with some of Canada’s most celebrated musicians, including Gord Downie, Devin Townsend, and producer Bob Rock (Metallica, The Tragically Hip, Mötley Crüe). With hypnotic vocals and immersive songwriting, her music drifts between electronica, alt-rock and indiepop, creating an atmosphere that is both haunting and transportive.

“Ché creates the kind of performance that completely transforms a theatre,” says RCA Theatre Programming Director Andrew Stauffer. “She has a powerful voice and a strong presence; her music is cinematic in scope, filled with emotion, and intimate.”

Ché was featured on a haunting duet with Gord Downie of The Tragically Hip and made guest appearances on Devin Townsend’s album *Lightwork*. These collaborations helped pave the way for her third solo album, *The Crowned*, co-produced by Bob Rock. Clash Magazine praised the record for “fusing pop, soul, and indie elements to produce something potent and original,” while Knotfest described the single “Falling Under” as a “timeless earworm.”

Over the years, Ché has shared the stage with acclaimed artists including Sondre Lerche, Michael Bubl , and Dan Mangan. Earlier in her career, she also caught the attention of renowned producer David Foster, leading to songwriting and recording opportunities in Los Angeles.

Before appearing at Tiny Lights Festival later that weekend alongside artists including Nightshades, Chloe Davidson, and Under the Rocks, all of whom have previously performed at the Mary Irwin Theatre, Ch  Aimee Dorval brings her cinematic and atmospheric live show to Kelowna audiences for an intimate evening at the RCA.
